2 2023 Project Focus

ALIA Guidelines for Multicultural Services

Rita spoke about the lack of current guidelines and the proposal put to ALIA to have a small group work with ALIA in 2023 to develop guidelines. This was put to ALIA at the end of 2022 and has been accepted as a project focus for 2023. People from our group can put their name forward to be part of this small working group working with ALIA staff.

Classification of A/V material is still an ongoing concern as it has affected communities and supply.

Guidelines need to consider a variety of formats and readership preferences as well as established and emerging communities and how to better cater for the complex needs of very diverse communities. Access to demographic data to work with.
